Health Board

Recent Work and Major Accomplishments Administration

- Organized and Implemented Emergency Response Regarding COVID-19 Pandemic including development of many protocols, for patient and employee screening, testing, masking, employee hazard pay, employee COVID-19 leave, etc.
- Purchase of new 10 Passenger Van with Wheel Chair access for patient transport.
- Purchase of new Mobile Clinic and development of protocols for use and implementation of route to visit Pit River Communities.
- Purchase of a new XL-Clinic Modular for providing Dental and Medical Services.
- Contracted with Architect Firm to begin designing new Burney Clinic construction expansion and remodel of current facility to add more space include new pharmacy and optometry services.
- Contracted with Architect Firm to begin designing remodel of current XL-Clinic to be integrated with new Modular.
- Withdrew from California Rural Indian Health Board full membership and P.L. 93-638 contract with the Indian Health Service California Area in preparation of compacting with Indian Health Service in the near future.

Health Board

Recent work and Major Accomplishments (cont.)

- Purchased a new Generators for Administration and Burney Clinic buildings to appropriately power so that all services can be maintained in case of power outages.
- Purchased and replaced all facility toilets and sinks with touchless toilets and sinks.
- Purchased additional air filter machines and filters for Community Members due to wild fires.
- Contracted with National Recruitment Firm to assist with recruiting a Chief Medical Director.
- Wrote and received grants from CDC for Pandemic Health Services, I.H.S. for Contracting and Compacting planning,
- Purchased a new enclosed trailer to assist with providing COVID testing services to the Pit River Community.
- Signed a 25 year lease (with renewable 25 year lease) with Pit River Tribe regarding Clinic Buildings and land at XL-Clinic and Burney (including 4.3 acres from Creek to Tamarack street to assist with our new construction at Burney).

Recent work and Major Accomplishments (cont.)

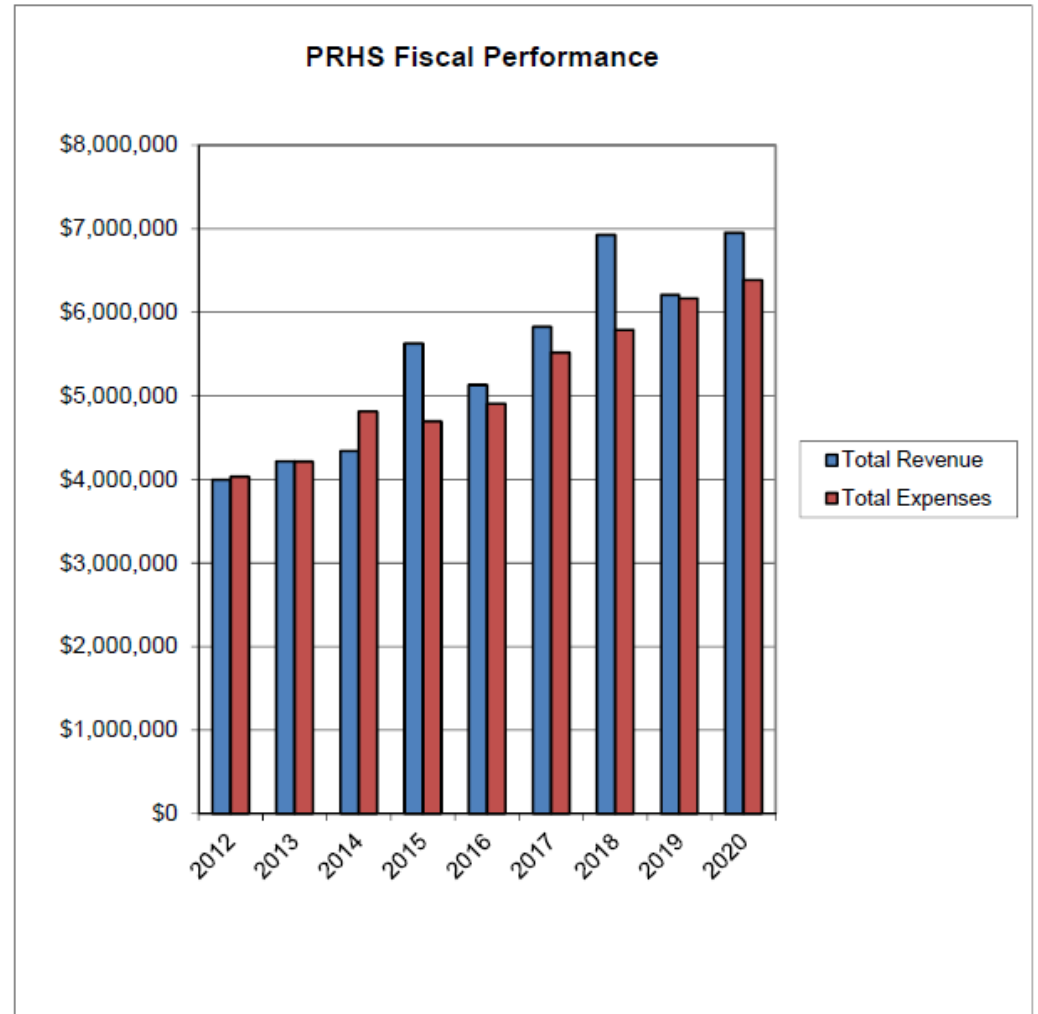
- Gathered over \$2 million in Capital Funding to assist with new Burney Clinic construction planned for 2022.
- Updated all PRHS job descriptions and hired additional staff to provide health services to the Pit River Community.
- Began preparing in 2019 for upcoming AAAHC Accreditation Survey in August, 2021 by updating department policy manuals, reviewing new accreditation manual, and conducting mock survey.
- Developed and approved a new more functional organizational chart.
- Developed a COVID-19 Vaccination plan with I.H.S. and became a HUB distributing vaccines to other Tribal Clinics in Northern California.
- Successfully recruited new Pit River Health Service Chief Executive Officer.
- Maintained Clinic Services without closure during the COVID-19 Pandemic.
- Completed Land Survey Documents for Burney Clinic between Creek and Tamarack Street which was approved by Pit River Tribal Council.
- In 2019 Board met with elders to gather input and improve communication.

Recent work and Major Accomplishments (cont.)

- Expanded Telemedicine on-site services to include behavioral health, pediatrics, and family medicine.
- Wrote and submitted Small Ambulatory Grant Application to the Indian Health Service for \$2 million to assist with construction costs of new Burney Clinic (note still waiting to see if it is funded).
- Applied to become a Tribal Federally Qualified Health Center with State of California which will allow us greater flexibility to provide services beyond the clinic four walls and get paid for those services at the all-inclusive rate.
- Completed our five-year strategic Plan for years 2017-2021 and began developing another five-year strategic plan for 2022-2026.
- Completed our internal and external maintenance on Burney clinic which provided us another patient exam room, intake office, and remodeled nurses station.
- Developed partnership with Shasta County regarding contract tracing for COVID-19 and other issues we now meet once a month.

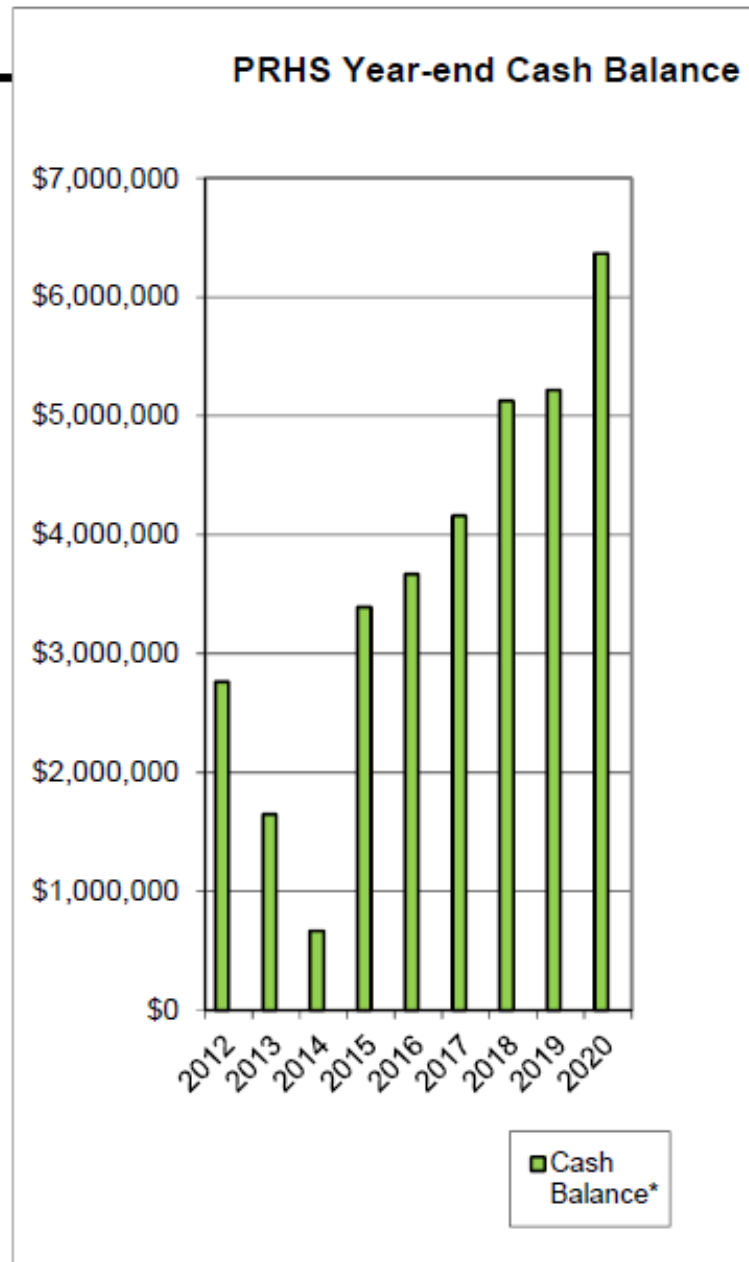
